

## 4H Archery Clubs in Pennsylvania

4-H is a great place to improve upon the skills of archery you learned by completing the National Archery in Schools Program. By becoming a part of a 4-H archery club you will have access to instructors who will help you learn about the sport, however, they might not all be certified instructors or coaches. Being in 4-H comes at a nominal fee that can vary between counties. However, this fee can usually be offset by the participant selling merchandise in the county wide fundraisers. Most clubs meet only once a week, once every other week or even once a month. Having this schedule allows individuals to be in more than one club if they would like to, as well as allow the individual to be in other sports and school programs. Attendance and club requirements will vary, depending on the leaders of the club. The only requirement that is standard among clubs is the need to complete a project book in order to compete or show your project at that county fair. The project book is a summary of everything that you were taught in the club that year. At the end of every summer, there is a county-wide 4-H fair where individuals can show off their skills and projects that they have learned that summer in 4-H. There also are showmanship competitions where the participants will compete against one another in their club. Not all archery clubs in Pennsylvania are run in the same manner, but all of the knowledge is the same. Below is a list of 4-H clubs that offer archery in their program. If you live in a county and do not see it on the list below, you can contact the Penn State extension office located in your county by visiting http://extension.psu.edu/counties to find the contact information for the extension office near you. If your county does not offer an archery program, then talk to your county extension agent to see what you can do to set up one in your area.
