Instructions

1. A final report is required under authority of Pennsylvania Game Commission policy 5302.02, regulations for day-old pheasant chicks to sportsmen's organizations and to comply with the state comptroller annual audit.
2. This report provides our propagation staff with information to assist and serve the interests of sportsmen's organizations participating in the pheasant chick program.
3. The report also assists our agency in compiling data on the number of captive reared game birds released in the Commonwealth.
4. All sportsmen's organizations participating in the pheasant chick program are required to complete a final report and submit to the Bureau of Wildlife Management by March 31. (Retain a copy for your information)
5. A renewal application will not be processed unless a complete report has been filed for the prior year.
