



Let's Wing It!!

Part One: Cut out the 3 parts that make up the wing - A, B, C and arrange them so that they are in the proper place to create a wing. Use a glue stick or tape to put the wing together.



Part Two: After your wing is together, cut out the labels below and glue or tape the correct label to the back of the feathers described.

PRIMARIES - Long, rigid feathers that originate behind the coverts, extending out to form the outer tip of the wing. They are responsible for forward thrust.

SECONDARIES - Found along rear edges of the wing and are usually shorter and rounded at the tips. They extend out from the coverts and are necessary for lift.

COVERTS - Smaller, rounded tip feathers found on the leading edge of the wing and cover the base of the primaries and secondaries. They provide insulation.
