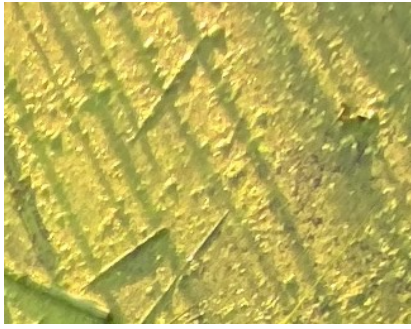
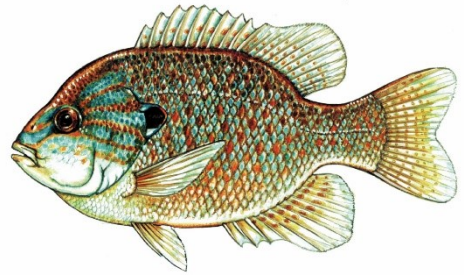

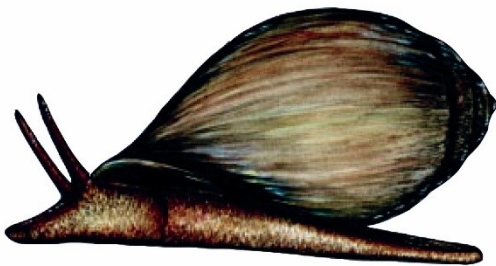

<p><b>Pumpkinseed</b> feeds heavily on aquatic snails. They also eat burrowing and other aquatic insects.</p>	<p><b>Algae</b> is a producer, so it makes its own food from sunlight. It's a living organism similar to plants.</p>
<p><b>Aquatic plants</b> are producers, so they make their own food from sunlight.</p>	<p><b>The American bittern</b> eats fish, crustaceans, amphibians, reptiles and small mammals.</p>
<p><b>Osprey</b> eat fish</p>	<p><b>Bullfrogs</b> eat insects, aquatic snails, other frogs, small fish, bats, birds, snakes and even turtles</p>
<p><b>Crayfish</b> They eat aquatic snails, insects, worms, tadpoles, dead aquatic animals, algae and plants.</p>	<p><b>Aquatic snails</b> eat algae and aquatic plants.</p>
