supervision of dispatchers, and coordination of agency professionals in administering a land leasing program of private landowners for public hunting purposes. Deiterich directly supervises seven Wildlife Conservation
Officers, five regional dispatchers, and one maintenance worker.

Officer Deiterich is a 1981 graduate of Central Columbia High School in Bloomsburg.
