BUREAU OF WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT

ADOPTED RULE MAKING

A. Amend 58 Pa. Code § 141.28.

<u>Commentary</u>: To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Commission, at its January 27, 2024 meeting, amended § 141.28 (relating to wild pheasant recovery areas) to eliminate age restriction and permit requirements and provide the Director the authority to annually designate WPRAs to be opened to hunting and establish appropriate season dates and bag limits. As a result of this regulatory change, all individuals eligible to hunt pheasants statewide would also be allowed to participate in pheasant hunting within WPRAs, subject to landowner permission. This amendment is now before the Commission for final adoption.

ANNEX "A"

CHAPTER 141. HUNTING AND TRAPPING

Subchapter B. SMALL GAME

§ 141.28. Wild pheasant recovery areas.

* * * * *

(b) *Prohibitions*. It is unlawful to:

(1) Release artificially propagated pheasants any time within any area designated as a WPRA.

(2) Hunt pheasants within any area designated as a WPRA, except the Director may authorize limited pheasant hunting opportunities in one or more WPRAs. During any year pheasant hunting opportunities are authorized in one or more WPRAs, the Director will designate the WPRAs where the season will be established, the dates of the season, and the daily bag limit.

B. Amend 58 Pa. Code § 139.4.

<u>Commentary</u>: To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Commission, at its January 27, 2024 meeting, amended § 139.4 (relating to seasons and bag limits for the license year) to provide updated seasons and bag limits for the 2024-2025 license year. This amendment is now before the Commission for final adoption.

Except as further restricted by this chapter, the seasons, bag limits, hunting hours and hunting regulations for migratory game birds shall conform to regulations adopted by the United States Secretary of the Interior under authority of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act (16 U.S.C.A. §§ 703-712) as published in the *Federal Register* on or about February 28 of each year. Exceptions:

(a) Hunting hours in § 141.4 (relating to hunting hours).

(b) Nontoxic shot as approved by the Director of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service is required for use Statewide in hunting and taking of migratory waterfowl.

(c) Hunting on Sunday not authorized. ¹

C. American Marten Reintroduction and Management Plan

<u>Commentary</u>: The American marten (*Martes americana*) is a furbearer once commonly found in portions of Pennsylvania but extirpated from the Commonwealth in the early 1900s due to deforestation and unregulated harvest.

In accordance with Goal 1.3b of the Pennsylvania Game Commission Strategic Plan 2020-2023 and as authorized by the Commission at its July 9, 2022 meeting, Commission staff developed an American Marten Reintroduction and Management Plan for Pennsylvania. The plan outlines a long-term, 10-year strategy, to translocate the species back to the state and then conduct long-term monitoring to evaluate the reintroduction. Communication strategies, partner engagement, costs, and timelines are also included.

At its September 16, 2023 meeting, the Commission authorized release of the proposed American Marten Reintroduction and Management Plan for a 60-day public comment period. At its January 27, 2024 meeting, the Commission tabled the proposed American Marten Reintroduction and Management Plan to allow for collection of additional information on habitat and human dimensions elements of the potential reintroduction.

All comments were considered and appropriate revisions to the plan were made. Staff compiled data confirming habitat suitability of potential reintroduction sites and clarified the underlying reasons for supportive or neutral attitudes towards marten reintroduction among respondents to hunter surveys. The Bureau of Wildlife Management is requesting final acceptance of the 2024-2033 American Marten Reintroduction and Management Plan.

INFORMATION RELEASE

- D. Release of Information for National Trapper Survey
- <u>Commentary</u>: The Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (AFWA) requested contact information for furtaker license holders in Pennsylvania for a National Trapper Survey being conducted in cooperation with Responsive Management. This will be the fourth iteration of this survey, which was previously conducted in 1992, 2004, and 2015. The goal of this study is to capture important information about trapping and trappers in the United States so that agencies can better understand and promote the activity for future generations to enjoy. Information gathered in this survey will also help agencies gauge the success of current efforts to recruit, retain, and reactivate trappers, plan future efforts to increase trapper participation, and guide future efforts of the Best Management Practices for Trapping program.

AFWA is requesting information for all individuals who held a Pennsylvania furtaker license (including lifetime license holders) during the 2021, 2022, and 2023 license years. The data specifically sought includes Customer Identification Number, license type, name, phone, e-mail, and street address. Section 325 of the Game and Wildlife Code generally restricts the release of customer licensing data, but an exception is permitted when the release of records or reports is "[a]uthorized by action of the commission for the sole purpose of exercising legitimate governmental function or duty." The Commission has evaluated the records request and determined that it meets this exception and, if approved, will result in the return of valuable survey data that will enhance its trapping program within this Commonwealth. AFWA will itself be subject to applicable criminal and civil restrictions regarding any further publishing, circulation, or disclosure of any records that it receives from the Commission under this authorization.

BUREAU OF WILDLIFE PROTECTION

PROPOSED RULE MAKING

A. Amend 58 Pa. Code § 147.805.

Since the mentored hunting program's initial inception in 2006, the program Commentary: has gradually grown and expanded to include additional species of game and wildlife and age groups eligible to participate in the program. With each progressive expansion, the mentored hunting program has come into closer alignment to the Commission's traditional hunting license structures. The Commission is now proposing to amend § 147.805 (relating to safety) to allow a mentor to accompany up to three of any combination of mentored youth or mentored adults at a time. This maximum limit of three would also include any junior hunter present and otherwise requiring accompaniment by the mentor as required by 34 Pa.C.S. § 2711(a)(8) (relating to unlawful acts concerning licenses) when the person is also serving as a mentor. This change will not expand the one lawful hunting device limit for mentored youth, but it will allow mentored adults and junior hunters to possess their own hunting implement while accompanied by a common mentor. The Commission has evaluated the relevant safety data and determined that the amendments will not create an unreasonable safety risk to the general public or persons participating in the hunt.

CHAPTER 147. SPECIAL PERMITS

Subchapter X. MENTORED HUNTING PROGRAM

§ 147.805. Safety.

While engaged in mentored hunting activities:

(1) A mentored youth shall be stationary, within arms reach and subject to the immediate control of the mentor at all times while in possession of any lawful hunting device. This limitation may not be construed to apply to mentored adults. Mentored adults shall be accompanied by the mentor within eyesight and in close proximity so that verbal instruction and guidance can easily be understood without the aid of electronic communication devices or sound amplification devices.

(2) A mentor may not accompany more than [one] <u>three</u> mentored youth or mentored [adult] <u>adults</u> at any given time. A mentor may [not] accompany a junior hunter in addition to accompanying a mentored youth or mentored adult <u>within the same maximum total of three</u>. The authorizations of this paragraph are not intended to expand the lawful hunting device limitation set forth in subsection (3).

(3) A mentor and mentored youth may not collectively possess more than one lawful hunting device at any given time. This limitation may not be construed to apply to mentors

and mentored adults participating in the mentored adult hunting program <u>or junior hunters joining</u> <u>a mentored youth hunt</u>.

(4) A mentor and mentored youth or mentored adult shall each comply with section 2524 of the act (relating to protective material required) and with any regulations promulgated by the Commission relating to protective material.

ADOPTED RULE MAKING

B. Amend 58 Pa. Code § 141.4.

<u>Commentary</u>: To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Commission, at its January 27, 2024 meeting, amended § 141.4 (relating to hunting hours) to replace the current hunting hours table and migratory bird hunting hours table to accurately reflect the dates and hours of legal hunting for the 2024-2025 hunting/trapping license year.

ANNEX "A"

CHAPTER 141. HUNTING AND TRAPPING

Subchapter A. GENERAL

§ 141.4. Hunting hours.

Except as otherwise provided, wild birds and mammals may be hunted 1/2 hour before sunrise to 1/2 hour after sunset.







B. Exchange

Contract No. L-3865, State Game Land No. 335, Tioga County

<u>Commentary</u>: Rachel M. Stone is offering 0.25+/- acres of land adjoining State Game Land No. 335 to the Commission in exchange for a 0.13+/- acre, nonexclusive right-of-way on State Game Land No. 335 to access the remaining Stone land, all of which is located in Union Township, Tioga County (Exhibit RED 4). 




C. Dedication of Borough Street





A. Non-Surface Use Oil and Gas Cooperative Agreement

Tract 245A-24, State Game Land No. 245, Washington County


<u>Commentary</u>: CNX Resources Corporation (CNX) of Canonsburg, PA requested the Commission offer its oil and gas rights under portions of State Game Land No. 245 for non-surface use development. The proposed tract, containing approximately 113+/- net acres, is located in West Finley Township, Washington County (Exhibit OGM 1).

CNX will access the 113-acre reserves from its current and planned drilling operations on adjacent areas off State Game Land No. 245 by horizontal drilling with no additional surface use or disturbance to the Game Lands. OGM staff negotiated the proposed terms of the agreement with CNX to prudently develop the Commission's oil/gas reserve and simultaneously protect the wildlife resources and recreational use of State Game Land No. 245.

The terms of the Agreement are a six (6) year paid up non-surface use oil and gas agreement, a \$4,000 per net oil and gas acre bonus payment and 19% royalty for all oil/gas and other liquids or condensates produced and sold from the proposed tract.

The bonus payment of \$452,000 and any rental payments will be deposited into the Commission's restricted account for the future purchase of wildlife habitats, lands, or other uses incidental to hunting, furtaking, and wildlife resource management. Future royalties owed the Commission will be directly deposited into the Game Fund.

Oil and gas development will be regulated by the Commonwealth's oil and gas regulations and the Commission's non-surface use oil and gas cooperative agreement.


