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5 PROCEEDINGS 1 2 3 CHAIR: I'd like to call this meeting together. 4 This is the regularly scheduled October meeting of the 5 б Pennsylvania Game Commission. Two announcements. 7 First of all, if you have cell phones, please turn them off or disable them. Secondly, as I indicated 8 yesterday, the Board did meet in executive session 9 10 last evening to discuss internal Board policies. At this point, I would like you all to join me in the 11 12 pledge to the flag. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE RECITED 13 14 CHAIR: 15 Mr. Secretary, will you call the roll of the members, please? 16 17 MR. PUTNAM: 18 Mr. President, all Commissioners are 19 present. 20 CHAIR: 21 Thank you. Is there a motion to approve 22 the minutes from the June 28th meeting? 23 MR. DELANEY: 24 So moved. 25 CHAIR:

6 Commissioner Delaney. Is there a second? 1 2 MR. SCHLEMMER: 3 Second. 4 CHAIR: 5 Commissioner Schlemmer. Is there any б discussion? Properly moved and seconded to approve 7 these minutes. All those in favor signify by saying 8 aye. AYES RESPOND 9 10 CHAIR: 11 Those opposed say no. Mr. Secretary? 12 MR. PUTNAM: Mr. President, the minutes are approved 13 14 by unanimous vote. 15 CHAIR: 16 Thank you. Motion passes. At this 17 point, we'll turn it over to Brad for the first item 18 under Bureau of Wildlife Management. 19 ATTORNEY BECHTEL: 20 The first item coming before the Commission today is the adoption of proposed 21 22 amendments to 137.34. To effectively manage the 23 wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Game 24 Commission proposed at its June 28, 2011 meeting to 25 amend Section 137.34 relating to chronic wasting

1 disease and the emergency authority of the Director to 2 update its terminology and procedures to be consistent 3 with the Commonwealth's Interagency Chronic Wasting 4 Disease Response Plan. The text of these changes are shown on page three of your agenda. 5 6 CHAIR: 7 Is there a motion? MR. ISABELLA: 8 9 Second --- motion. 10 CHAIR: Commissioner Isabella has moved. 11 Is 12 there a second? 13 MR. MARTONE: 14 Second. 15 CHAIR: Commissioner Martone has seconded. 16 Is there any discussion? 17 18 MR. ISABELLA: 19 Mr. President? 20 CHAIR: Commissioner? 21 22 MR. ISABELLA: 23 I would like to just submit an amendment. 24 What I would like to do is replace page three, which 25 is in our agenda booklet, and would submit this blue

8 1 copy. The changes are very minor. There is the 2 change at paragraph 2(b). There is a new paragraph 3 and paragraph 3(b). 3 4 CHAIR: 5 Okay. It's been properly moved to delete page three in our agenda and insert this blue 6 7 replacement page. Is there a second? 8 MR. MARTONE: 9 Second. 10 CHAIR: 11 Commissioner Martone. Is there any 12 discussion on this amendment? 13 MR. ISABELLA: 14 Yes, Mr. President. 15 CHAIR: Go ahead. 16 17 MR. SCHREFFLER: Concerning the amendment, I'd just like 18 to express my concern that when time is of the essence 19 20 with CWD in a particular area, will the Pennsylvania 21 Department of Ag move effectively to curb the imminent 22 danger of CWD in the area? And I have real concerns 23 about that. That's all I have. Thank you. 24 CHAIR: 25 Okay. Is there any further discussion?

1 Hearing none ---.

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MR. DELANEY:

Yes, Mr. President. Just some commentary 3 with regards to this amendment. At the public comment 4 session yesterday, the Department of Agriculture 5 actually was here. And I think it needs to be said 6 this is the second or third meeting that we had 7 business to discuss chronic wasting disease and the 8 effects on the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and 9 10 hunting, and I just think it needs to be reiterated that the Pennsylvania Game Commission and the 11 12 Department of Agriculture, in my opinion, have done 13 everything humanly possible to be prepared for when it 14 arrives. So the general public needs to know and 15 completely understand that our Executive Director and the Commission has done everything possible. 16 And I 17 think that this language just shows the public where 18 we're at with this. Thank you. 19 CHAIR: 20 Any further comments? Okay. We are voting on the motion to amend. All those in favor 21 22 signify by saying aye.

Those opposed say no. Mr. Secretary?

10 1 MR. PUTNAM: Mr. President, the motion to amend 2 3 Exhibit A passed unanimously. 4 CHAIR: 5 Okay. We now have an amended motion. Is there any discussion on the amended motion? Seeing 6 7 none, all those in favor of the amended motion signify by saying aye. 8 AYES RESPOND 9 10 CHAIR: 11 Those opposed say no. Mr. Secretary? 12 MR. PUTNAM: Mr. President, the motion to pass Exhibit 13 14 A passed unanimously. 15 CHAIR: 16 Okay. Thank you. Brad? ATTORNEY BECHTEL: 17 The next item before the Commission is 18 19 the adopted rulemaking of proposed amendments to 20 Section 147.701. To effectively manage the wildlife 21 resources of this Commonwealth, the Game Commission 22 proposed at its June 28th, 2011 meeting to amend 23 Section 147.701(relating to general) to reduce the 24 applicability of the CITES tag to bobcats and 25 international exports only. The text of this change

11 is shown on page five of your agenda. 1 2 CHAIR: Is there a motion? 3 MR. ISABELLA: 4 5 Motion. 6 CHAIR: 7 Commissioner Isabella moves. Is there a 8 second? 9 MR. BOOP: 10 Second. 11 CHAIR: 12 Commissioner Boop seconds the motion to 13 adopt this. Is there any discussion? Hearing none, 14 we shall take the vote. All of those in favor of this 15 signify by saying aye. 16 AYES RESPOND 17 CHAIR: 18 Those opposed, say no. Mr. Secretary? 19 MR. PUTNAM: 20 Mr. President, the motion passes unanimously. 21 22 CHAIR: 23 Thank you. 24 ATTORNEY BECHTEL: 25 The next items to come before the

Commission are from the Bureau of Wildlife Habitat
Management. And they concern the acquisition of two
parcels of real estate.

The first is Contract Number 3588 on 4 State Game Land Number 238 in Fayette County. 5 The estate of Tito Tiberi is offering for sale 115 acres 6 7 of land in German Township, Fayette County adjoining State Game Land Number 238 as shown on Exhibit RED 1 8 on page seven of your agenda. The option price is a 9 10 \$100,000 lump sum to be paid with funds from thirdparty commitments for compensation of habitat and 11 12 recreational losses associated with installing an above-ground temporary water line on an existing 13 14 right-of-way across state game lands. Approximately 15 100 acres of the property is forested, primarily with northern hardwood. There are multiple forest openings 16 17 covering approximately ten acres with an additional five acres of shrub lands and reverting old fields. 18 The northeast portion of the parcel has significant 19 20 frontage on SR 166. This tract joins two separate parcels of State Game Land 238 and has an internal 21 22 road network that connects to existing state game land roads. 23

24The second acquisition is Contract Number253589 on State Game Land No. 81 in Huntingdon County.

1	Menno Z. and Martha H. Hoover are offering three
2	tracts of land for sale totaling 413 acres of land in
3	Dublin and Springfield Townships, Huntingdon County,
4	adjoining State Game Land Number 81 as shown on
5	Exhibit RED 2 on page eight of your agenda. The
6	option price is a \$745,000 lump sum to be paid with
7	escrowed funds from the land exchange on State Game
8	Land Number 176 with the Pennsylvania State University
9	and will require approval from the United States Fish
10	and Wildlife Service. The property is forested with
11	mixed oak, hickory and white pine in various stages of
12	regeneration. The entire property will fill in a
13	large indenture and provides much needed access into
14	State Game Land Number 81 from Township Road 301.
15	<u>CHAIR:</u>
16	Is there a motion to approve this?
17	MR. DELANEY:
18	Mr. President, I'll make a motion for the
19	acquisition of Contract Number 3588 and Number 3589.
20	<u>CHAIR:</u>
21	Thank you. That was Commissioner
22	Delaney. Is there a second?
23	MR. SCHREFFLER:
24	Second.
25	<u>CHAIR:</u>

Commissioner Schreffler seconded. 1 Is there any discussion? Hearing none, we shall proceed 2 to vote. All those in favor signify by saying aye. 3 AYES RESPOND 4 5 CHAIR: Those opposed say no. Mr. Secretary? 6 7 MR. PUTNAM: Mr. President, the motion passes 8 9 unanimously. 10 CHAIR: 11 Thank you. 12 ATTORNEY BECHTEL: The next item concerns two land 13 14 exchanges. The first is Contract Number 3590, State 15 Game Land Number 287 in Armstrong County. The 16 Pennsylvania Department of Transportation is offering 17 2.825 acres of land adjacent to State Game Land Number 287 as replacement land for .65 acres of State Game 18 19 Land Number 287. Both tracts are located within Boggs 20 Township, Armstrong County, as shown on Exhibit RED 3 on page ten of your agenda. The .65 acres of State 21 22 Game Land Number 287 was needed during an emergency 23 road repair to correct a landslide on SR 1031, Section 24 5S1, referred to as the Limeback Slide Area Project. 25 The replacement land is forested and is located just

1 north of the project area.

2	The second exchange is Contract Number
3	3591, State Game Land Number 79 in Cambria County.
4	The Nanty Glo Water Authority has agreed to a land
5	exchange involving a right-of-way 6,750 feet long and
б	20 feet wide, and another right-of-way that is 54 feet
7	long and 20 feet wide in exchange for a 2.65-acre
8	parcel of land in Jackson Township, Cambria County
9	adjoining State Game Land Number 79 as shown on
10	Exhibit RED 4 on page 11 of your agenda. The
11	Authority reserves a 25-foot wide easement along the
12	current border of State Game Land 79 and also along
13	that part of the tract which adjoins Ogden Road. The
14	tract is forested with young cherry, maple and beech
15	and has hemlock in the bottomland. Stewart Run, a
16	stocked trout stream, bisects the property.
17	<u>CHAIR:</u>
18	Is there a motion to approve?
19	MR. ISABELLA:
20	Motion.
21	<u>CHAIR:</u>
22	Commissioner Isabella. Is there a
23	second?
24	MR. MARTONE:
25	Second.

16 1 CHAIR: Commissioner Martone seconds it. 2 Any 3 discussions? Hearing none, we shall proceed to vote. All those in favor signify by saying aye. 4 AYES RESPOND 5 6 CHAIR: 7 Those opposed say no. Mr. Secretary? 8 MR. PUTNAM: 9 Mr. President, the motion passes unanimously. 10 11 CHAIR: 12 Thank you. ATTORNEY BECHTEL: 13 14 The next item concerns the purchase of 15 properties at auction and tax sale. This is an information item, and no action is required. 16 It is Contract Number 3592, State Game Land Number 108, in 17 18 Cambria County. Subject to certain limitations, 19 Section 135.241 of 58 Pa. Code authorizes the Director 20 to bid on real estate, oil, gas or mineral rights at 21 auction or tax sale and to request down payment checks 22 to bid on property at auction. Successful bids must 23 be made known to the general public at the next 24 regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of 25 Commissioners.

On May 20th, 2011, the Game Commission 1 2 was the successful bidder at a tax sale held at the Cambria County Courthouse and purchased the mineral 3 rights or fractional interests on seven tracts located 4 in Dean and White Townships, Cambria County under 5 State Game Land Number 108 as shown on Exhibit RED 5 6 7 on page 13 of your agenda. A total of 896 fractional mineral interest acres were purchased for the total 8 amount of \$19,600. 9

10 The next item that concerns oil, gas and minerals is the Coal Refuse Pile Reclamation Project 11 12 State Game Land Number 100 in Centre County. Waroquier Coal, Inc. of Clearfield, Pennsylvania has 13 14 requested a lease to mine and remove abandoned coal 15 refuse on a portion of State Game Land Number 100 as shown on Exhibit OGM 1 on page 15 of your agenda. 16 The 17 proposed project will entail approximately 15.5 acres, of which 3.7 acres consist of unreclaimed coal refuse 18 spoil piles to be removed. The remaining acreage will 19 20 be utilized for access to the removal site, 21 reclamation of an abandoned surface mine pit and 22 highwall, and construction of E&S controls and 23 operational support. 24 The accumulated coal refuse royalty value

25 of the project has been estimated at approximately

\$25,000. Removal and reclamation of the spoil piles 1 2 will reduce ongoing pollution into Contrary Run, provide for improved water quality and also provide 3 potential wetland restoration along Contrary Run. 4 The operator will implement a site-specific wildlife 5 habitat and reclamation plan as per the direction of 6 7 the local land management group supervisor. No merchantable timber is to be affected by this 8 reclamation project. 9

10 In exchange for the refuse removal and reclamation project, the operator will pay the 11 12 Commission a royalty of ten percent FOB pit price or a 13 minimum of 50 cents per ton, whichever the greater, 14 for each and every ton of coal refuse mined and 15 removed from site. Monies received from the sale of coal shall be credited to the reclamation cost of the 16 17 abandoned highwall and mine spoils within the project 18 Any remaining royalties shall be deposited into area. 19 the game fund.

20 <u>CHAIR:</u> 21 Is there a motion to adopt this? 22 <u>MR. SCHREFFLER:</u> 23 So moved. 24 <u>CHAIR:</u> 25 Commissioner Schreffler. Is there a

19 second? 1 2 MR. MARTONE: 3 Second. CHAIR: 4 5 Commissioner Martone seconds it. Ιs б there any discussion? Hearing none, we shall vote. All those in favor signify by saying aye. 7 AYES RESPOND 8 9 CHAIR: 10 Those opposed say no. Mr. Secretary? 11 MR. PUTNAM: 12 Mr. President, the motion passed 13 unanimously. 14 CHAIR: 15 Okay. This brings us to old business. Α 16 lot of the items that we had --- we had two items 17 yesterday that we heard from the staff on. Are there 18 any motions relative to the grouse plan and Bobwhite 19 plan? 20 MR. SCHLEMMER: 21 Mr. President? 22 CHAIR: 23 We'll start with Commissioner Schlemmer. 24 MR. SCHLEMMER: 25 I move we accept the grouse plan as

20 presented by staff on Monday, October 3rd. 1 2 CHAIR: 3 Is there a second? MR. ISABELLA: 4 5 Second. 6 CHAIR: 7 Commissioner Isabella seconds. This is a 8 motion to accept the grouse plan as presented. Ιs there any discussion on this? Hearing none, we shall 9 10 vote. All those in favor signify by saying aye. 11 AYES RESPOND 12 CHAIR: 13 Those opposed say no. Mr. Secretary? 14 MR. PUTNAM: 15 Mr. President, the motion to accept the grouse plan is moved unanimously. 16 17 CHAIR: Thank you. The Bobwhite plan, is there 18 19 any ---? 20 MR. DELANEY: Yes, there is. 21 22 CHAIR: 23 Go ahead. 24 MR. DELANEY: 25 Mr. Commissioner, I'm going to make a

motion that we accept the Northern Bobwhite Quail plan 1 2 as presented to us yesterday. 3 CHAIR: Is there a second? 4 5 MR. SCHREFFLER: 6 Second. 7 CHAIR: Commissioner Schreffler. Properly 8 motioned and seconded to accept the Bobwhite Quail 9 10 plan. Is there any discussion? Hearing none, we shall vote. All those in favor signify by saying aye. 11 12 AYES RESPOND 13 CHAIR: 14 Those opposed say no. Mr. Secretary? 15 MR. PUTNAM: Mr. President, the motion to accept the 16 17 Northern Bobwhite Quail plan is approved unanimously. 18 CHAIR: 19 Okay. Thank you very much. Also under 20 old business, letter A is a Born Free request. We'll 21 turn to Mr. Hough. 22 MR. HOUGH: 23 Thank you, Mr. President. As you heard 24 the staff report yesterday from Director Palmer, it 25 was an integrated effort. And as you look down each

1 one of those items, we felt that some of them were 2 violations of current regulations and certainly didn't need to be changed. We totally agreed with the humane 3 dispatch. However, that's not clearly defined 4 anywhere. We teach humane dispatch in our classes. 5 As you heard yesterday from the Pennsylvania Trappers 6 Association, they also endorse that. 7 The last issue was, in fact, a statutory 8 issue, not a regulatory issue, so that's going to be 9 10 dealt with by the Assembly, not by the Board. So it's our recommendation that we think we have a very good 11 program both education-wise and enforcement-wise, and 12 we would recommend that the Board take no action on 13 14 Born Free's petition. 15 CHAIR: 16 Thank you. Having heard that, is there 17 any discussion or any motions from any Board member concerning this? Hearing none, we shall move on. 18

19 We're going to new business, and at this time I'll 20 call on Commissioner Schlemmer.

MR. SCHLEMMER:

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Thank you, Mr. President. In recognition of staff, on behalf of the Board of Commissioners, I would like to recognize the 14 years of service of the Executive Secretary, Frances Szweda. She retired here

1 on September the 30th. She took care of all of our 2 paperwork. Anything we needed done, presentations, you name it, she took care of it. She is not here 3 She cleaned out her desk yesterday. And 4 today. unfortunately, she had a death in the family. 5 And Fran, on behalf of the Board, we'd like to thank you 6 7 for your dedicated service. Thank you. 8 CHAIR: 9 And I'm certain we all feel Thank you. the same way. Before we go to announcements, is there 10 any other new business that any Commissioner has to 11 12 present at this time? 13 MR. DELANEY: Mr. President, this is not really new 14 15 business, but I should have offered a comment with 16 regard to the quail management plan that we passed 17 today. Since we live stream these meetings anymore, someone might turn around and think, wow, there was no 18 discussion about the quail management plan. But we 19 20 heard a detailed report yesterday from the biologists 21 and we've been working on this for months, so I didn't 22 want the public to think that we just sat there and 23 there was little discussion. So I just wanted to offer that. 2.4 25 CHAIR:

Very good. Thank you. Is there other 2 comments for the good of the order or any new 3 business? I will draw your attention to what's published here. Our January meeting will be scheduled January 22nd, 23rd and 24th in Harrisburg. And hearing no further discussion, we stand adjourned. * * * * * * * * HEARING CONCLUDED AT 8:51 A.M.
