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4	ATTORNEY BECHTEL: The first item on
5	today's agenda to come before the Board comes from
6	the Bureau of Wildlife Management it concerns an
7	adopted rulemaking to amend 58 PA Code Section
8	133.21 relating to classification of birds, to add
9	the northern goshawk, Accipiter gentilis, to the
10	Commonwealth list of endangered birds. The
11	Commission has also amended Section 133.21 relating
12	to classification of birds to remove the peregrine
13	falcon, Falco peregrinus, from the Commonwealth's
14	list of threatened birds. The text is shown on
15	pages three and four of your agenda.
16	PRESIDENT KNICK: Do we have a
17	motion?
18	<u>COMMISSIONER LAYTON:</u> So moved.
19	PRESIDENT KNICK: Okay.
20	Second?
21	<u>COMMISSIONER MITRICK:</u> Second.
22	PRESIDENT KNICK: Any comments?
23	<u>COMMISSIONER LAYTON:</u> If I could, Mr.
24	President. So I appreciate the falconer's coming
25	and talking to us, but I have to, I just have to

take pause. I mean, we've got two nesting pairs of 1 2 - what are we talking, two nesting pairs of goshawks 3 right now as opposed to, what 20 years ago, we had what, maybe 22 nesting pairs? 4 5 I think as an agency, if we don't 6 take action now. In fact, those - I talked to 7 Matthew privately after the last meeting and I'm 8 like what - what took so long. And it's all about 9 the data and, I get that now. But I think as an agency, if we don't 10 11 do something now and we don't do something quickly, 12 I think we're negligent. So I would support listing 13 the goshawk and I would ask my fellow commissioners to lend their support as well. 14 15 COMMISSIONER MITRICK: I would also 16 like to say something. I've given a great deal of consideration to this issue we've heard from many 17 18 sources regarding this subject. There is strong 19 agreement that the numbers of northern goshawks in 20 Pennsylvania are precipitously low. This is also 21 true of the northern goshawks migrating through 22 Pennsylvania. 23 The people who are primarily opposed 24 to this listing - are falconers. By listing 25 goshawks as endangered, they will no longer be able

to take young goshawks from their nests or take 1 passage birds. I truly appreciate their pain in not 2 3 being able to do this. I feel that by listing the northern 4 5 goshawk as endangered, it will receive the much needed attention to its plight. Hopefully its 6 7 numbers will increase so they can be delisted as we 8 are now with the peregrine falcon. Thank you. 9 PRESIDENT KNICK: Thank you very 10 much, Commissioner. Madam Secretary, would you call for the vote please. 11 12 COMMISSIONER SCHNEPP-GIGER: 13 President Knick? 14 PRESIDENT KNICK: Yes. 15 COMMISSIONER SCHNEPP-GIGER: Vice 16 President Mitrick? 17 COMMISSIONER MITRICK: Aye. 18 COMMISSIONER SCHNEPP-GIGER: Commissioner Foradora? 19 20 MR. The auction price is 21 \$400 per acre to be paid from the Game Fund. Access 22 is from Cove Road. 23 COMMISSIONER LAYTON: Motion to 24 accept. 25 COMMISSIONER MITRICK: Second.

Ayes have it 5, 1 1 2 Commissioner abstained from voting. 3 ATTORNEY BECHTEL: The next item on 4 the agenda appears on page 13 concerning an 5 exchange, Contract Number L-3787, State Game Land 6 Number 198, in Cambria County. 7 Sunoco Pipeline, L.P. or Sunoco, is 8 offering to cause to convey a total of 1.69 more or 9 less acres of permanent right-of-way and a total of 10 0.12 more or less acre of temporary construction right-of-way to provide a total of 2,940 more or 11 less linear feet of administrative and public road 12 13 access into State Game Land Number 198 from Memorial 14 Drive, T-417, in Washington Township, Cambria County 15 as shown on Exhibit RED 3 on page 14 of your agenda. 16 Sunoco is offering these rights-of-17 way in order to fulfill their commitment under a 18 2016 Annual License for Right-of-Way granting Sunoco 19 the privilege of constructing, operating, 20 maintaining and removing natural gas liquids 21 pipelines on State Game Land 198 in Cresson and 22 Washington Townships, Cambria County, and Juniata 23 Township, Blair County as shown on Exhibit RED 4 on 24 page 15 of your agenda. 25 The 25-foot-wide permanent rights-of-

17 way and the temporary construction rights-of-way 1 2 being offered by Sunoco will be granted as follows; 3 one, a total of 0.90 more or less acre of permanent 4 and a total of 0.04 more or less acre of temporary 5 rights-of-way from the Township of Washington on two separate parcels. Two, a total of 0.42 more or less 6 7 acre of permanent and 0.01 more or less acre of 8 temporary rights-of-way from Raymond C. Guzic, Jr. 9 and Jenny R. Guzic. 10 Three, 0.003 more or less acre of 11 permanent right-of-way from Richard R. Sweeney, John 12 G. Sweeney and Daniel R. Sweeney. Four, 0.04 more 13 or less acre of permanent and a total of 0.06 more 14 or less acre of temporary rights-of-way from 15 Highland Sewer and Water Authority. And five, 0.33 16 more or less acre of permanent and 0.01 more or less acre of temporary rights-of-way from Richard R. 17 Sweeney, Linda L. Sweeney, Daniel R. Sweeney and 18 19 John G. Sweeney. 20 Sunoco will also cause to complete 21 significant improvements to the existing roads, 22 create a new parking lot to further improve public 23 access, and acquire all necessary permits to allow 24 for these improvements and their future operation 25

and maintenance by the Commission. The license

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1	authorized a total of 11,066 more or less feet of 16
2	inch and a total of 11,083 more or less feet of 20
3	inch natural gas liquids pipelines in a 50 foot wide
4	right-of-way, along with a total of 6.07 more or
5	less acres of temporary workspace and a total of
6	6,532 more or less feet of temporary access road use
7	for construction and reclamation of the pipelines.
8	In addition to causing to convey the
9	permanent and temporary rights-of-way and causing to
10	complete the improvements as outlined above, Sunoco
11	also paid the Commission's standard habitat, surface
12	and timber damages at the time of license execution
13	and has paid and will continue to pay the
14	Commission's standard annual license fee so long as
15	the license remains active.

This has been a long time coming. And 10 I'm excited to see this quail plan going into place. You know, I just want to thank Matthew for the work 11 12 he's done on the quail plan and his staff obviously. 13 All the people in the field, - this is huge for 14 Pennsylvania. 15 So having said that I would support 16 that this - you know, the - this - not just this plan but the ongoing propagation of quails in 17 18 Pennsylvania and hopefully we get a point where we 19 have our own numbers of quail and we can take them 20 out and transplant them throughout the state of 21 Pennsylvania so people can enjoy them. Hear 22 bobwhite quail in the wild again and - and kind of 23 bring that back in Pennsylvania. I know the numbers 24 across the state of Pennsylvania are never going to 25 be what we had before because we're just not that

kind of state. But the work that we've done as an 1 2 agency, that you've done, just goes to show the 3 dedication to wildlife in Pennsylvania. Thank you 4 for that. Appreciate it. 5 DR. SCHNUPP: Thank you, Commissioner. 6 7 PRESIDENT KNICK: Anything else? Any motions? 8 9 COMMISSIONER LAYTON: It's already 10 been moved and seconded. 11 PRESIDENT KNICK: All right. With no further comment, Madam 12 13 Secretary, can you please call for a vote? 14 COMMISSIONER SCHNEPP-GIGER: 15 President Knick? 16 PRESIDENT KNICK: Yes. 10	of those situations really show the real success of
11	this right, for taking the peregrines off and
12	putting the goshawks on. We finalized that plan and
13	it's just been approved and I think one of the main
14	themes across all of those projects is partnership.
15	And what those guys have done at
16	Letterkenny has been incredible. I mean it really
17	has. Those guys have really stepped up to the
18	plate. Our team in the Bureau of Wildlife
19	Management has been incredible and what they have
20	gotten done with Wildlife Habitat Management. Same
21	thing with goshawks and you know, if we can work
22	through partnerships to get these things, that's our
23	primary concern is to get these things back up in
24	good numbers. And we'll partner with everybody we
25	need to to get that done. So I just want to thank

23 everybody for your support. 1 2 COMMISSIONER LAYTON: Thank you, 3 Matthew. 4 COURT REPORTER: Can I have your -5 can I have his last name please? DR. SCHNUPP: Schnupp, S-C-H-N-U-P-P. 6 7 MR. BURHANS: Well today, you know, 8 is - as historic this meeting with the listing of 9 the goshawks. There's one other - this is the last 10 meeting for Commissioner Layton. You know, as 11 Executive Director, it's a very unique opportunity. 12 You have a Commissioner, they come in, they serve serve the agency, and then their term expires. 13 And 14 to work with somebody for eight years, dealing with 15 so many issues, you can't help but build that 16 relationship and develop a friendship. 17 And today is Tim's last meeting and I 18 want to personally thank him for his guidance, his 19 mentorship. He has served this agency well, 20 superbly actually, and dealt with some very 21 difficult issues from CWD to listing of the goshawk. 22 And some exciting times, like down- or upgrading or 23 I don't know which way you say it's when you go in a 24 good direction for peregrine falcon and others. And 25 he's been a tremendous team player.

The relationship between Executive 1 2 Director and the commissioners is so vitally 3 important and Tim has done just a tremendous job. Tim, I want to thank you for 4 5 everything you've done for me, everything you've 6 done for the commissioners, the staff. Thank you 7 very very much. And we have a little special item 8 for you we'll present to you in a minute. But I 9 know some others probably would like to comment. 10 PRESIDENT KNICK: Commissioner 11 Layton, I going to have to repeat everything Bryan 12 said almost. I really appreciate it. It was an 13 honor serving on this board with you. And you have 14 given me some guidance and I really appreciate that. 15 Thank you very much for all your service, Tim. 16 COMMISSIONER MITRICK: Tim, I'd also 17 like to thank you. It's been a pleasure being on 18 the Board with you, I have learned a lot from you. 19 And I appreciate you brought a lot of the enthusiasm 20 to this Board and kept it moving in the right 21 direction. So thank you for all that and I wish you 22 the very best in the future. 23 COMMISSIONER LAYTON: Thank you. 24 MR. BURHANS: And can you work on 25 getting a cell phone tower in Johnstown?

25 COMMISSIONER LAYTON: Yeah, no. 1 2 There's no - no cell phone towers. 3 MR. BURHANS: Any other comments from 4 the - from the Board? 5 PRESIDENT KNICK: Yes -. 6 COMMISSIONER FORADORA: Yes, this is 7 Commissioner Foradora -. 8 COMMISSIONER SCHNEPP-GIGER: 9 Commissioner Layton. 10 COMMISSIONER FORADORA: Oh sorry, go 11 ahead, Kristen. 12 COMMISSIONER SCHNEPP-GIGER: Mr. 13 Layton, for me, from the outgoing guy to the newest 14 commissioner on the board, and I won't be able to 15 say that for too too much longer. I do appreciate 16 the guidance and the mentorship, the passion and the humor you brought to this board. And have been very 17 18 very instrumental in keeping us a cohesive unit, a 19 well functioning unit. I've learned a lot from you 20 and I'm looking forward to continuing to work with 21 you in different capacities. 22 COMMISSIONER LAYTON: Thank you for 23 that. 24 COMMISSIONER FORADORA: Commissioner 25 Layton, this is Commissioner Foradora. I echo all

the comments. It's been a pleasure serving with you 1 2 and I look forward to interacting with you in the 3 future. And I praise your leadership that you 4 quided the agency for the last eight years. Thank 5 you. 6 COMMISSIONER LAYTON: Thanks Scott. 7 COMMISSIONER FREDERICKS: 8 Commissioner Fredericks. Tim, I can't thank you 9 enough for the energy and the effort you put into 10 serving as Commissioner for eight years. And most 11 importantly your leadership. And congratulations on 12 being one of the few commissioners that served as 13 president for two terms. That just goes to show the 14 confidence that your fellow commissioners had in you 15 and your leadership abilities and keeping that big 16 green battleship headed in the right direction. 17 Can't thank you enough, good job. Enjoy your

18 retirement. Thank you.

19 <u>COMMISSIONER LAYTON:</u> So can I - can 20 I just say a in lieu of flowers, donations can be 21 made in the goshawk restoration, sounds like my 22 funeral. I just want to say, you know, I - I 23 appreciate all you guys and everything that you've 24 done. I've built some great friendships. And I'm 25 going to miss everybody that's here. I will not

miss talking about CWD. But I think - you know, I 1 2 talked to everybody already. I've expressed my 3 wishes. But I just want to thank you all for 4 5 - for the support that you've given this board and 6 the Board has given the staff and all the work that 7 you people do. I was telling Mitchell this morning, 8 you know you always have that person when you're 9 walking through Walmart that you run down the other 10 aisle when you see them coming. There's really no one in the Game Commission. And that says a lot 11 12 that - you know, if I'm walking down the street and 13 I see somebody wearing a green hat, I'm going to go 14 talk to them. And that says a lot for this agency. 15 And I just appreciate from the field staff to the executive office, everything that 16 you're doing for wildlife and everything that you're 17 18 doing for this agency. And I just wish you all the 19 best. 20 MR. BURHANS: Thank you Tim. And if 21 I could have the help of Mr. President, we'd like to present to you an item on behalf of Board of 22 23 Directors and the entire staff. 24 We'd like to present to you - to my 25 last picture, you're all standing up.
