# PENNSYLVANIA IMPORTANT MAMMAL AREA #27 Wyoming State Forest

**COUNTY(IES)** Sullivan, Lycoming, Schuylkill

**APPROX. SIZE** 43,570 acres

**OWNERSHIP** Public (State)

### **CATEGORIES/CRITERIA**

• Sustains a confirmed viable local population of a Species of Greatest Conservation Need and the species or subspecies regularly occurs at the site during one or more seasons

### DESCRIPTION

Located in the eastern portion of the Allegheny Plateau northeast of Williamsport, the area is covered by extensive, unfragmented northern hardwood-hemlock forest. It includes narrow stream valleys (Kettle Creek Gorge, Loyalsock Creek). There are five distinct habitats, including grassland, swamps, deciduous and coniferous forests, and shrubby areas, each with a distinctive flora and fauna.

## **MAMMAL NOTES**

Ogdonia Creek provides habitat for northern water shrews and streamside habitat for rock voles (found at Angel Falls near Ogdonia).

### **CONSERVATION NOTES**

Because of the occurrence of yellow-bellied flycatcher and a high concentration of forest interior species, the area has been designated an IBA (#42, Wyoming State Forest and World's End).
